

HELPSHEET: HOW TO OFFER TERMS OF TRADE TO PHONE BOOKINGS

Purpose

In this help sheet we provide you with guidance on how to offer your **terms of trade** to a **phone booking** so that your terms and conditions apply at **the time of booking**.

Key Information

- Your terms of trade must be offered to your customer to view and be accepted **before** you perform the work or services if they are to apply.
- If you take bookings via phone and do not issue a separate quote or estimate, you need a **method to confirm your contract for services** with your customer so that your pricing is accepted and your terms of trade apply.
- This means your customer must be able to **view and read** your terms of trade **before** accepting the services.
- There are a few ways that your customers can **accept your terms of trade** for a phone booking:
 - **By clicking an online link** provided in an **email confirmation** to view the terms of trade page on your website
 - By receiving an email confirmation of the job booking with your terms of trade attached as a PDF or a hyperlink to the terms of trade page on your website



• **By viewing the terms of trade** from an **SMS Text** that directs them to your terms of trade and rates published on your website.

Option 1 | Insert a Hyperlink to Your Terms of Trade Page to a Confirmation Email

1	Load your terms of trade to your website and create a web-address that opens the terms of trade page or PDF. See our Help Centre for guidance on this. e.g. www.yourwebsite.com/terms-of-trade
2	Add Tradie Terms recommended wording to your Confirmation Email issued to your customer and include a hyperlink to your web-page containing your terms of trade and a link to your privacy policy. By placing your booking with us you are agreeing to our <u>Terms of Trade</u> . All personal information collected for the purposes of our services will be treated in accordance with our <u>Privacy Policy</u> .

Option 2 | Attach your Terms of Trade to your Confirmation Email

1	Attach your terms of trade to your Confirmation Email as a PDF attachment.
2	Add Tradie Terms recommended wording to your Confirmation Email issued to your customer and include a PDF attachment containing your terms of trade and a link to your privacy policy.

2	Add Tradie Terms recommended wording to your Confirmation SMS issued to your customer and include a hyperlink to your web-page containing your terms of trade and a link to your privacy policy.
	By placing your booking with us you are agreeing to our rates and terms. You can view these by clicking <u>Terms of Trade</u> . All personal information collected for the purposes of our services will be treated in accordance with our <u>Privacy Policy</u>
